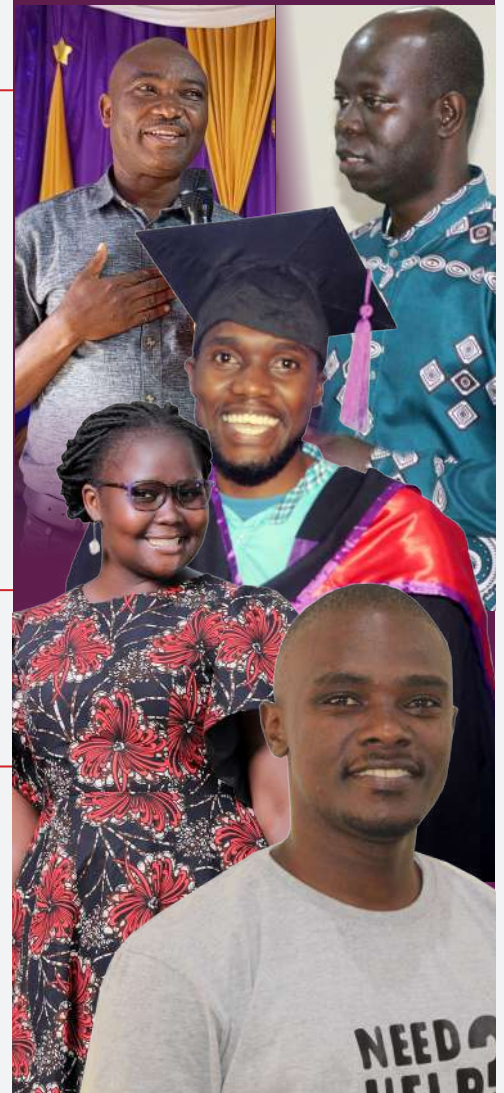

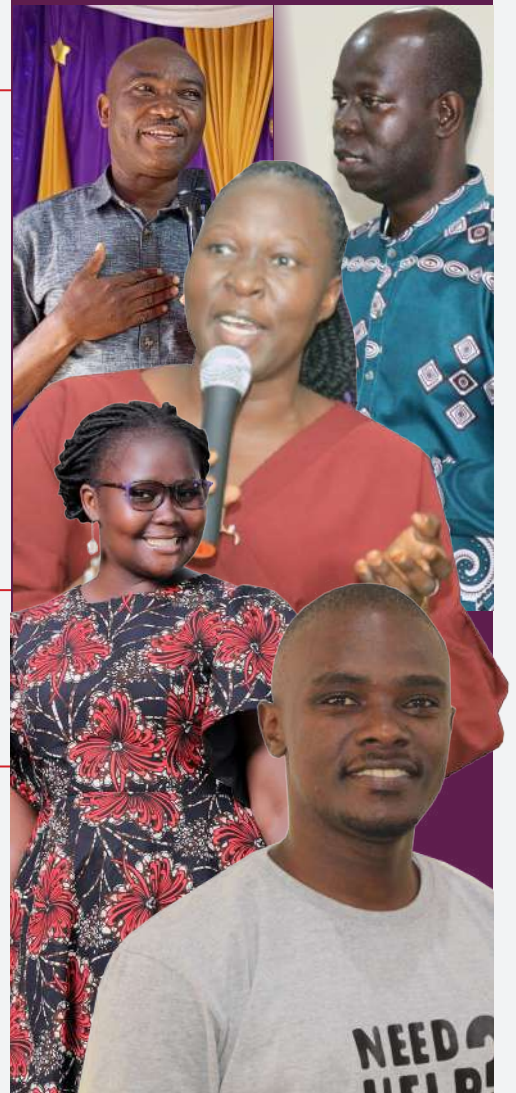

From a life of an imperfect Christian who perpetually faulted the law of God, Mama Vivian Angella Alungat was called to serve God in 2017. With an audience of only 1 person to now hundreds of followers within the country and around the world, Abba Father Fellowship (AFF) located in Mbale City in Eastern Uganda has become the fulcrum of revival ministry in Uganda.

It all started as an instruction from God to pray for Sister Jennipher Namono who had stomach complications and had failed to heal. Mama Vivian, as she is fondly referred to by the believers, encountered failure whenever she went out to carry out this errand.

She later picked courage to go and pray for sister Jennipher and she got cured. Eventually, prayers started from her home with 4 people. This prayer group of 4 people would pray together and later go to St Andrew's Cathedral-Mbale for lunch hour.

One afternoon, Mama Vivian heard that there was an overnight service in St. Andrew's church and went only to be told by Pastor Joseph that ministry was at hand and that she should get ready.

With encouragement from Pastor Joseph, Mama Vivian started the Glory to Glory Fellowship that later, by the guidance of God,

became the Abba Father Fellowship Ministry from her house, then to Elgon nursery premises to now Bugema B (Mpale Mbaya) cell that is housing the main home of Abba Father Fellowship.

Abba Father Fellowship has now expanded to Kampala Altar located on Muteesa II Road-Nakawa Division, Kampala.

Today, the ministry has grown to two chapters in the country and the ministry has gone international.

I would like to deliver my gratitude to the pioneers who are still with the ministry; indeed you have stood the test of time, the test of patience in the Lord as He unveils His plans in Abba Father Fellowship.

Over the years, our God has been aligning the ministry and bringing us to order today the ministry has birthed

So this was a directive for us to move to a place I had no idea about, to a place I had no money for, to a place that was going to be our permanent home as a ministry. But I thank God that we acquired this land and God provided.

We serve a God of abundance and I can boldly say, we have our permanent home as a ministry in Mpale Mbaya, Bugema, Mbale District.

One of the motivations that kept me strong besides the vision, was the committed team behind me. God surely gave me a dedicated team, a team full of integrity, I have never seen a team like the team in Abba Father Fellowship. These

Many are intrigued by my childhood. As a young girl, I was raised in a Catholic setting. I would say we grew up while knowing that praying was optional. I grew up asthmatic, I was so sickly and fragile. But one of the stories, and I still have some pictures in my mind, were a python wanted to swallow me. My mother was right with me in the bush where she had gone to cut grass for our house in the village. Not forgetting I come from Katakwi District, in the eastern part of Uganda, where the wise people come from.

So this python came out of the blue and the person that rescued me was an old



woman. She came and kicked me like a ball and tried to fight this python from swallowing me.

I grew up attached to Born-Again churches. I was not really attached to my Catholic faith as my family was. I was moved by the way the Born-Agains used to pray. For instance PAG church in Soroti that is where my spirit wanted me to fellowship from. And then when I moved to Mbale, I started moving with Born-Agains and that is how I saw my calling manifesting.

As a little girl, I knew I had a calling because all my dreams were about stars, bright stars and I believed there was something about me. And I would always wake up knowing the next step of my life.

The launch that is set to happen on 10th December is one dream I have waited for long to come to pass. It is a dream I have wanted to live in.

On this day I want to glorify the name of the Lord for the journey. I did not rush to launch this ministry because this is a prophetic ministry.

The day of 10th is so prophetic and it is the day I want to sit and listen to testimonies, testimonies of 5 years, the achievements of God through me in 5 years. It is also another day that the Abba Father Fellowship children will be reconciled, many who left the ministry will be coming back to celebrate the ministry on the day of the launch. I am expecting miracles to happen on that day. It is one of my dreams that is coming to pass in 2022.

- They organise church events like baptism, thanksgiving services, weddings, cultural festivals.

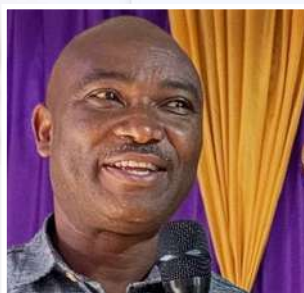

The role of the Communications department is to pass on information, such as announcements about the activities of the fellowship to the congregation. The members also manage the online platforms.

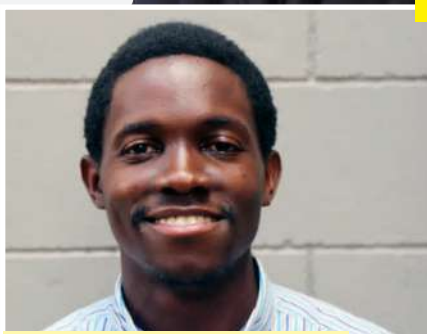

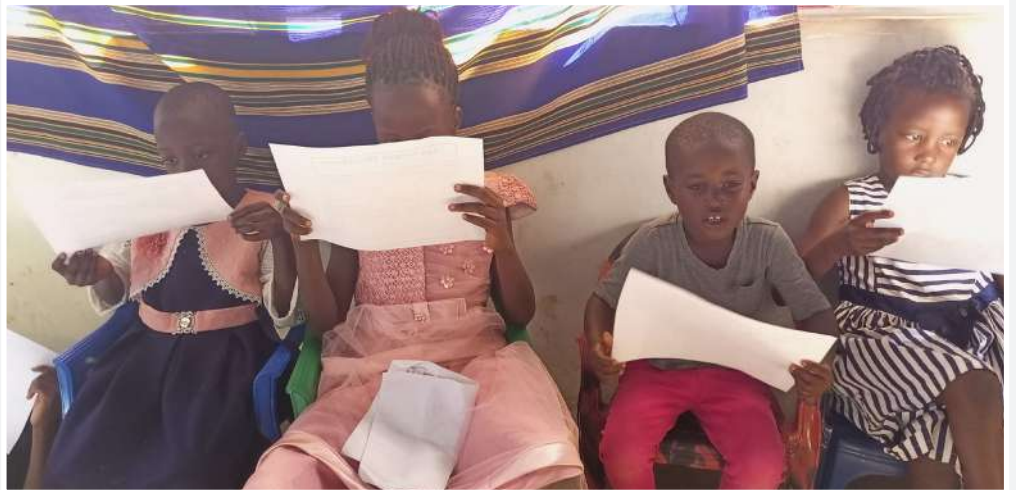
Little Lambs

Little Lambs have children of various ages who are divided into three age groups every Sunday.

I didn't know Glory to Glory would grow this big

With all sincerity when we started as Glory to Glory Fellowship I did not expect the ministry to grow this big within a short period of time. I thought we would remain fellowshiping within households and friends.

I remember four women who we fellowshiped with: Sis. Jennifer Namono who happens to be the first member, Mama Grace Mutenyo and two old women who are no longer part of the fellowship.

I would preach to the women, but the first pastor was Ps. Joseph Dradria, who was a student at Livingstone University at the time and he was also preaching at lunch hour services in one of the churches here in Mbale. We used to attend the service, and in the evening, we would convene at Mama Vivian's house to fellowship.

The first miracle I saw was that of an old man, a husband to one of the first members. He was bedridden and could not move due to diabetes and stroke. Mama Vivian asked us to keep praying for him. We visited him once and Mama prayed for water, and she gave him to drink and after three days when we visited him, we saw him walk.

From then forth, I had faith in this ministry, and I began to distance myself from the faith I had in the church where I used to pray. I began to see that this is how God moves, He want to be closer to his people and I became so attached to the ministry. One of the first prophecies she gave me was about the points I was going to get in my UACE exams and when the results were out, it was the exact points I got.

Secondly, a lady named Rebecca came to the fellowship with a friend of hers - a magistrate called Molly and mama sees Sis. Molly and tells her: "Your deliverance is in this ministry, but I am interested in your sister Nancy."

Molly confirmed having a sister with that name and after some time, we met Sis. Nancy, who became Mama's friend.

The ministry is repairing, especially the broken-hearted people and spreading love and I have seen people who have come with pain being transformed, broken relationships and families have been mended, which is great thing.

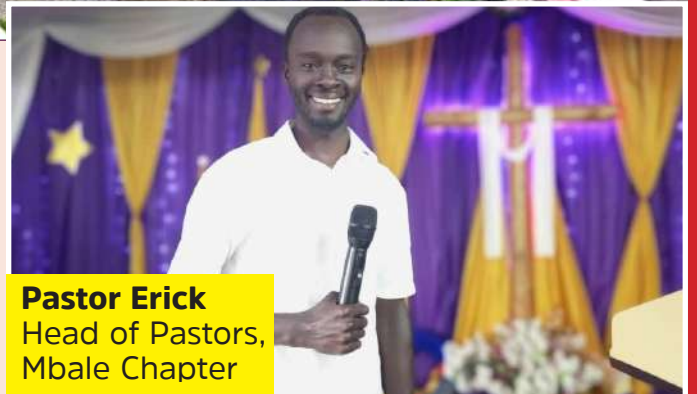


It was around 2016, when I had a turnaround point in my life. It was a word from God for me to resign from my job and turn my full attention to serving God.

At that time my daughter was about one-and-a-half years old and there were bills to be paid. Besides, my wife and I also had dependants. I resigned without thinking. Besides this job being good, serving God proved to be the best choice I could ever make. So it was in the living room of Mama Vivian's home that I got my first message of how I was going to serve in the house of God.

At that time, the ministry was without a name and it just started with a few members. It started with Sister Jennifer Namono, who now ministers in the choir. But at that time prayers were done at 2pm every Sunday as most of the members were still connected to their religious churches.

Personally, I used to attend church at St Andrews cathedral and then at times St Austin's, a mix of Anglican and Catholic. I remember in the Catholic Church, I was given the role to head the youth. Meanwhile, during this time, I was in the choir with my cousin Sarah, we were actually the first choir members, that is in

a ministry without a name, but we were Mama's first choir members.

We would sing, usher and then at the same time pastor Emma, Mama and myself would do preachings at different intervals. So service had no specific time because people would call Mama, they wanted to visit her at any time because of the different challenges they had.

So it got to a point where Mama requested us to stay at her house from morning to evening to do the singing. Anyone that came to see Mama, we would go in and start praise and worship as Mama carries out deliverance and at the same time we were ushering.

I remember Pastor Emma Otim would hold the buckets as Sarah and myself would do

the ushering. There's a particular day we sang nonstop because of the influx of people coming in for prayers. We sang that day, without food, but that was ministry and that was the call God had given us.

It was also at that moment Mama Grace came in. She had cancer. Mama Grace brought some man called David, the owner of Elgon Nursery and Primary School. He joined the fellowship at Mama's home and that's the period people had become so many. It was majorly old people, old women and David was the only elderly man. It was at that point that David saw that Mama's home had become small, and yet people were many and also at the same time Mama's neighbours' started complaining about their parking grounds, the noise and so it was time for the fellowship to get a new home.

The ministry that began with about 6 people, grew to about 20 plus people and Mama's living room could not contain all these people. That's how Elgon became the new home for the fellowship and it's from there that the ministry got its first name, Glory to Glory Fellowship.

From Elgon, we started weekly programmes on Mondays and Fridays and then service on Sundays. The desks or class benches of Elgon were quite uncomfortable, but again, we had to serve God in all conditions.

Then comes Sister Rebecca, who then brings Chief Molly. Now Chief Molly is the one who birthed the Kampala chapter. God spoke in her life and in the lives of her family members. God gives her a message to bring her family members for prayers, deliverance prayers at Mama's place. Sister Molly then brings all her sisters, one of her sisters - Mama Nancy - was set to wed at that time, but there was witchcraft playing behind the scenes. During this time, there was someone that had brought a gift that had charms, and if this lady had opened it, she was going to get blind. But God spoke and instructed them on what to do through the woman of God, Mama Vivian.

Back to Elgon, God speaks of how the place had become small and how He needed a new and permanent home. The number of men had increased - we had Brother Peter admin, Peter and Richard Watuwa and various others. We also got a few challenges at Elgon and we knew it was time to move.

As the number of congregants grew, we also got new preachers like Pastor Annette, Pastor Sophie who joined while we were in Elgon, Pastor Jennifer, Pastor George also comes in 6 months after we had initially started the ministry. Choir was under Sister Jennifer, ushers were under doctor Watanga, the finance under Sister Eunice.

It's at this point that Mama then gets invited to Nigeria for a prayer retreat and when she returns, God instructs her to hold prayers in Kampala. Chief Molly's sister, who was set to wed, actually wedded and the witchcraft was broken. She was now the one mobilising prayers in Kampala. The first place of choice for the prayers was Ndere, but the shrines there couldn't allow us to pray. God could not be mixed with darkness and management also refused to give us space.

So we ended up in some place in Ntinda called Satellite. It was at Satellite that I met Mama Nancy's husband, Pastor Simon, Pastor Roy, Brother Julio and a few others who are still with us to date. Pastor Simon and Mama Nancy eventually became the leaders of the Kampala branch. In Kampala, Pastor Simon and Mama Nancy offer their business premises for the fellowship and it started in a tent and till today, we are on the same grounds. Kampala became the home for overnights.

Back to Mbale, we return to our normal routine of fellowshiping at the school, only to find it closed. And it was a prophesy from Mama that we would wake up one day and find the whole school closed and we wouldn't have anywhere to pray from. The various challenges at the school caused us to start a fundraise for land.

Mama Grace and Mr. Watanga helped look around for land for the ministry. All the pieces of land they got, God denied them. Now God leads Mama Vivian, Mama Grace and Mr. Watanga to a place in Mpale Mbaya and that was where God permitted.

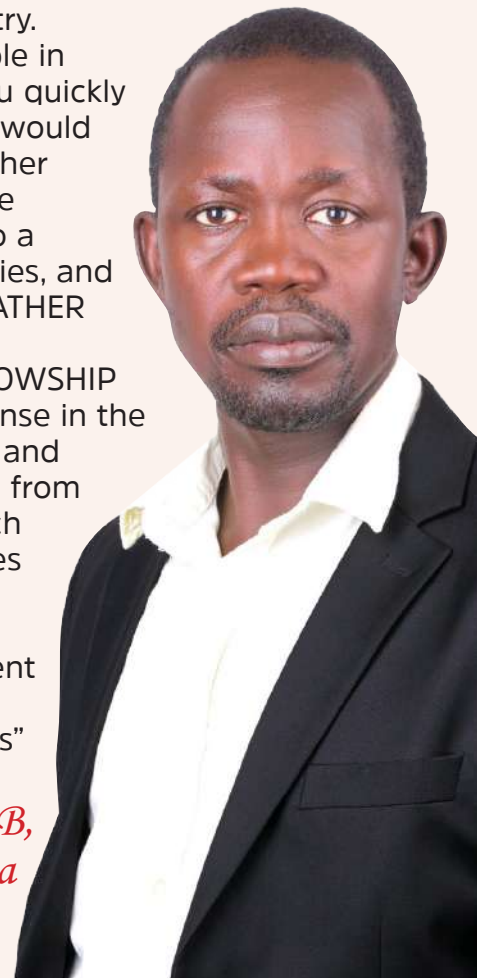

Charity

The Abba Father Fellowship Welfare Department is headed by Pastor Patrick Busiima and Sister Susan Obita.

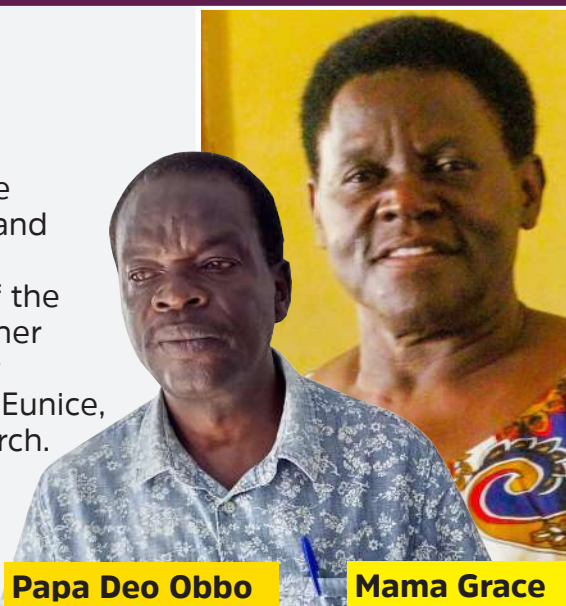
The department ensures every member of the fellowship is well taken care of every time they are within the church premises. It also organises functions.

From no job to two jobs

I was working and living in Kamwokya. I had a job, which had lasted four years, but it was not paying what I expected. I left the company in December 2017.

I then started applying for other jobs. In January 2018, I got two jobs and later settled for one job in February up to July 2018 when I lost the job. I was jobless from August 2018 and was literally only surviving since the situation was hard.

I later started receiving calls from Sister Joyce, my fiancée, who was in Mbale. She told me about a servant of God, Mama Vivian, who was coming to Kampala and that I needed to meet her for prayers. Being a Catholic then, I had a negative attitude towards 'saved people' since I had been to one of the churches around Kampala and didn't receive much.

One Saturday, I decided to go with sister Joyce to meet the servant of God. It was during the first Thanksgiving of Glory to Glory (first name of Abba Father fellowship).

The next day, Sunday after the prayers, I was blessed to meet the servant of God. She didn't pray, but she looked at me and prophesied in my life. I told her that I didn't have a job and she said, "it is well."

Around January of 2019, someone asked for my CV and I shared it with him. In the process of looking for a job, Joyce was involved in an accident and I did not have any coin on me.

I was, however, helped by an old friend. The accident affected her leg and arm. After sometime,

she received a miracle of healing after Mama Vivian prayed for her and she stopped using crutches.

In the same period, one of the companies (NLS), where I had applied called me for an interview, which I didn't expect. I went and did the interview. I also received a call to go and do an interview with Mengo Hospital. And another with a tour and travel company in Nsambya.

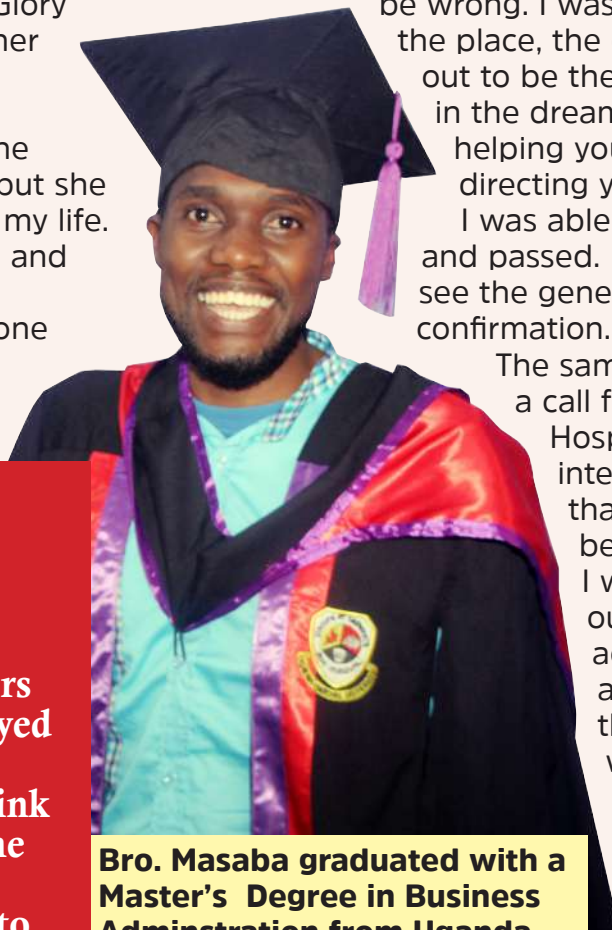
Mama had earlier told me that there was a job that was coming. She added that it would not be only one company, but a number of companies. In the same period, I was able to do three interviews.

refused to take the job because of money. He asked me to go back to Mengo and discuss the salary again.

I was able to meet the human resource manager and she handed me the contract. To my surprise the amount stated in the contract was much higher than what I had even asked for. This was indeed God. I was asked to go with the contract and later return it after signing. I now had two jobs and I was not sure which one to take. I met Mama Vivian who directed me to Pastor Simon and he helped me in making a decision of which job to take on and I started work in June 2019.

I was able to go to church the next Sunday and gave my testimony. I didn't have a job, but now God had given me two jobs.

In my family, most members are not employed yet well educated. I think I am almost the only one who has been able to maintain a job. This was a turning point for me and I believed that God was going to change the life of my other family members.

I am Susan Adokober Obita, a member of Abba Father Fellowship Kampala and I would love to testify about the goodness and healing power of GOD.

It was in the year 2010 when I fell sick while at work in Northern Uganda. I got seizures in the middle of the night and they were very severe to an extent of me going into a state of unconsciousness.

I was taken to Kitgum Mission Hospital, but my condition was not getting any better, then I was airlifted to International Hospital Kampala.

I was taken to ICU and was there for ten days.

After several and thorough check ups, MRI Scans and CT Scans were done, which ruled out their suspicion of epilepsy and they confirmed that I had a haemorrhage, growth on my brain which was the start of a brain tumour.

When I regained consciousness, I was started on medication that I took for six years of my life and this costed my family a lot of money.

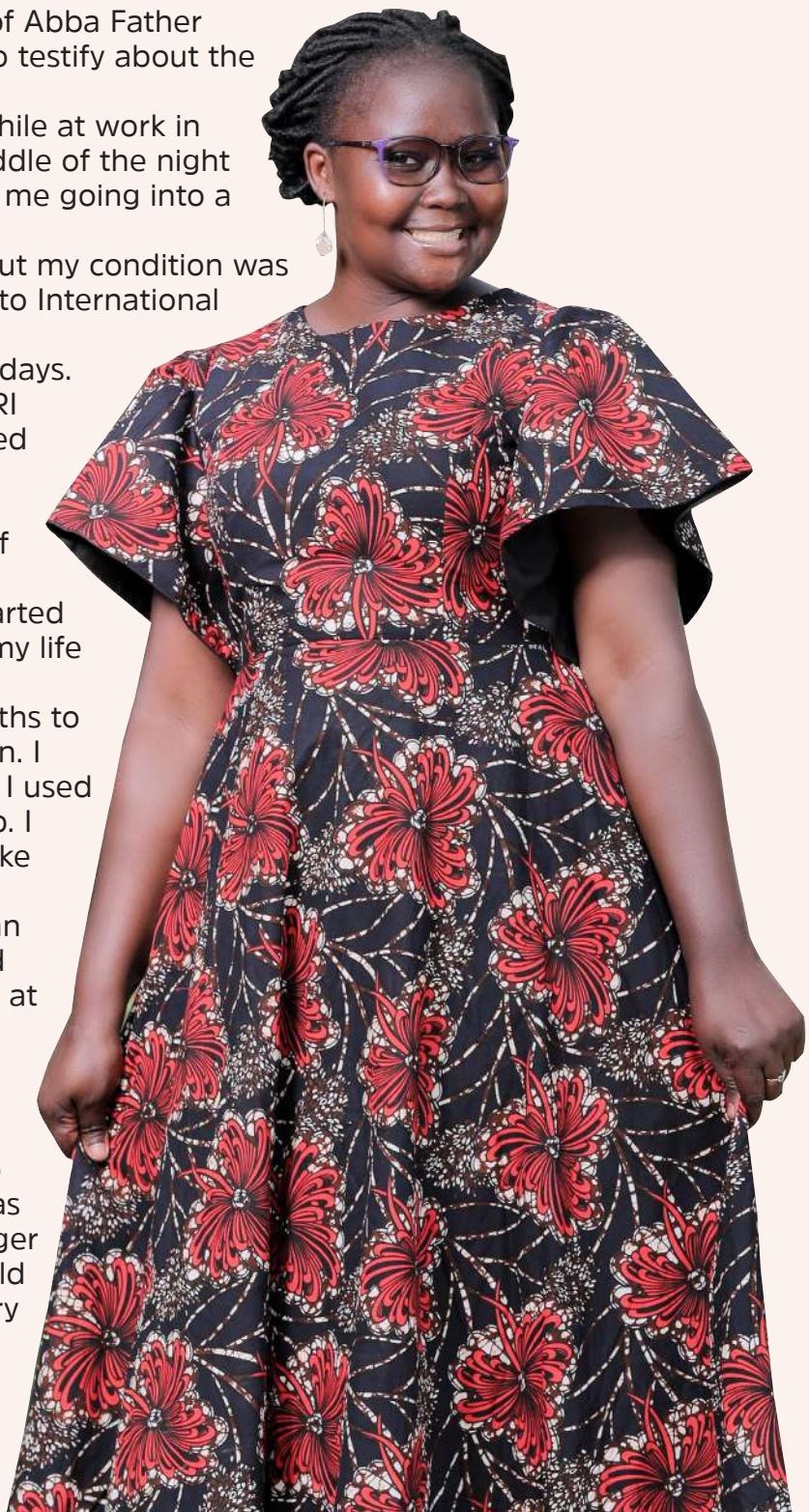
I would do MRI scans after every six months to monitor the size of the growth on my brain. I took various drugs every day for six years. I used to have severe headache and lack of sleep. I had a sleep disorder that I could stay awake most of the time, even at night.

It was in the year 2018 when Mama Vivian came back from Nigeria and we organised the very first fellowship in Kampala. it was at Satellite Hotel in Kisaasi.

Jesus restores blind Bro. Ariko's eyesight

My name is Ariko Richard. I am a police officer. I was introduced to Abba Father Fellowship by sister Betty, who was already a member of the church.

I thank God so much because He healed me through Mama Vivian.

A brief history of how the sickness began

I am a police officer and I work in Kyankwanzi District although my family is in Kampala.

On the 26th August 2022, I requested my bosses from Kyankwanzi to allow me come to Kampala to attend the wedding of my sister-in-law.

I travelled to Kampala on 26th of August and we had the wedding on 27th August in Mutungo Kampala. I then travelled back to Kyankwanzi on the 28th.

When I reached Kyankwanzi, at around 22:00hrs, I opened my door, entered my house and slept.

At around midnight, I woke up and found that I was very ill; my head was aching so much. I felt as if my eyes were popping out, as if my ears were about to burst.

I could not swallow saliva. The situation was very bad. I went to a clinic and was given some treatment, but I still wasn't okay.

The doctors referred me to Kampala, so I came to Paramount Hospital in Wandegaya, where a CT scan was done on my head and the results showed that I had something called suprasellar hyperdense mass in my brain. That it was developing in my brain and it's what was killing my sight because at that moment, the left eye could not see totally, I could not see anything. I was in too much pain.

I went to Mulago Hospital, where I was admitted for roughly 8 days and I was on serious treatment, but the sickness was not getting cured.

I was discharged and I came back

home while still very sick. On the day of discharge, I was told that I would be booked for surgery after three months. I was also told to keep swallowing some tablets up to the day of the surgery.

While I was in the hospital, I called pastor Simon and he prayed for me. He prayed for me time and again. So, when I came home, I continued swallowing the medicine, but also kept in contact with Mama Vivian for prayers.

That was the time I was discharged, so I came home, and then I went to church Abba Father Fellowship, where I was prayed for.

After the prayers, I started getting some relief; the pain in the head started subsiding until one day when Mama Vivian was present in the church.

Immediately, Sister Betty gave me a call, saying Mama was around and asked me to

come for prayers. So, I immediately got on a boda and went to church and fortunately, I found when Mama Vivian was present and she prayed for me.

When she prayed for me, the headache disappeared.

Remember, I was completely blind in one eye, but when she touched me, I started getting back my sight. I can now see.

I now feel that the surgery should not take place in the mighty name of Jesus Christ and I believe that I am now healed and will not go for the surgery.

TESTIMONY OF GOD'S TRANSFORMING POWER

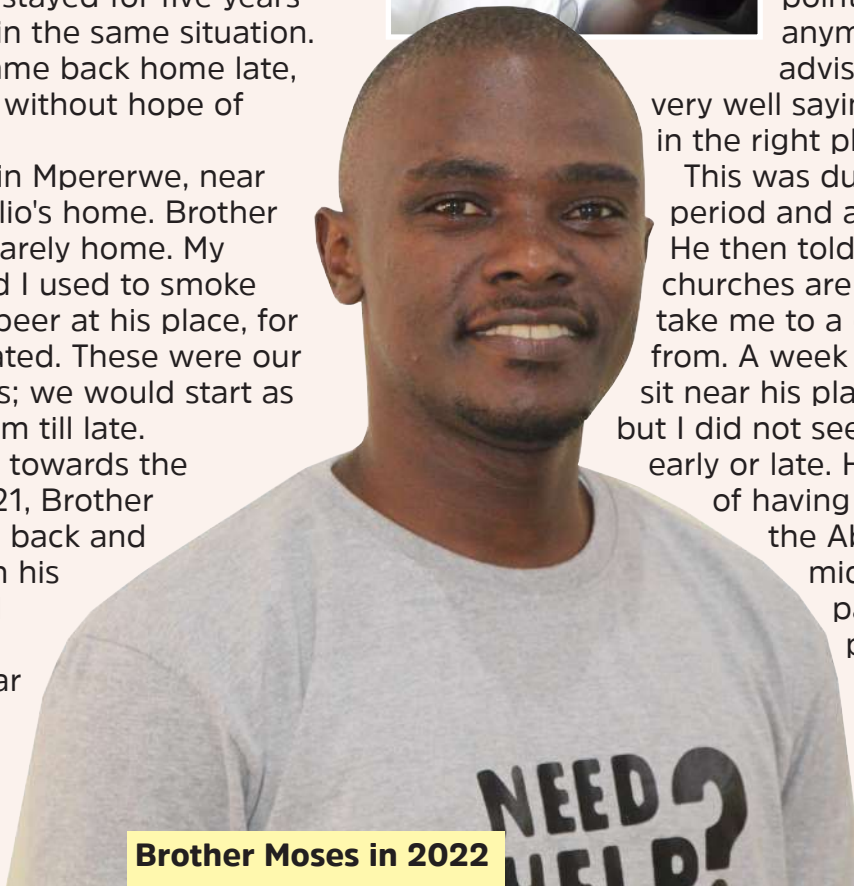
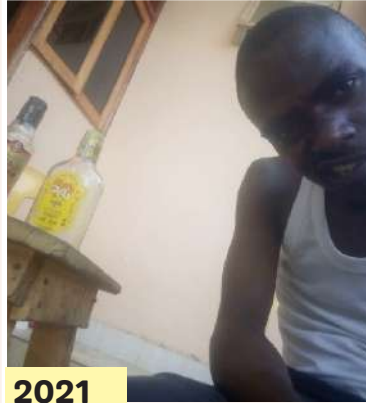
My name is Mundrana Moses. I live with a young beautiful lady. GOD blessed us with two beautiful children. We went through a lot before my transformation. My family members, including my mother, had given up on me when they learnt that I was smoking and drinking.

My mother had given my brother and I land, which we sold. This broke her to the point that she never wanted to see me again. Life got harder, full of pain misery, disorganisation, lies, theft, smoking, plus fights with the lady I loved. I guilt-tripped, I blackmailed.

I was a daily drinking officer with no job. I got one job opportunity, but I could hardly sustain it for a month. I stayed for five years and more in the same situation. I always came back home late, drunk and without hope of tomorrow.

We lived in Mpererwe, near Brother Julio's home. Brother Julio was rarely home. My friends and I used to smoke and drink beer at his place, for it was isolated. These were our daily habits; we would start as early as 7am till late.

One time, towards the end of 2021, Brother Julio came back and found us in his compound drunk with loud secular music playing. I had done this over and

over again. I had reached a point, where I felt tired of this kind of life, for I never found the meaning of life. My life had become empty, problems that I drunk to avoid caught up with me the moment I was sober. One day, while drinking and smoking near Brother Julio's house, he came back home. I really didn't know whether he actually used to go for prayers neither did I know if even probably prayed! But he looked organised.

I burst into tears and told him of how I was tired of the life I was living. I told him how I probably needed prayers because I had reached a point that I couldn't take it anymore. Brother Julio calmly advised me and I recall him

very well saying: 'if it's prayers, you are in the right place.'

This was during the lockdown period and all churches were closed. He then told me immediately the churches are reopened; he would take me to a church where he prayed from. A week passed and continued to sit near his place to drink and smoke, but I did not see him. He would come early or late. However, he had spoken

of having my number added onto the Abba Father Fellowship midnight prayer WhatsApp page, where they had prayers online. I kept hope alive that I would be added to this group, which later happened.

By GOD'S grace, the lockdown was lifted and churches were

allowed to reopen. Brother Julio finally gave me a call and invited me to come with him to his church. I did not know Mama Vivian, but I would see the name a lot on the midnight page. The first time I stepped in Abba Father Fellowship church, I felt such a calming presence that I desired to keep coming on Sundays regardless of whether I had hang over or not. I felt love, peace hence the value of life. I started seeing how much I had missed in life, but I would still sneak a bottle of booze before proceeding home after church. My wife would notice, but at least there were some noticeable changes in my life like the love for prayers every Sunday morning without being forced. One Sunday, Mama Vivian came from Mbale to pray at the Kampala chapter. Brother Julio had earlier told me not to miss the service. I went to church with a hangover.

I was lucky that Mama prayed for me that day. After she left, I felt a fire that I had never felt before inside of me. I sweated for six to seven minutes. I felt light. I felt like the air I was breathing was fresh. The burden I had had was lifted and I felt free.

Mama prophesied in my life that day and everything she said was true. When I was going back home, I could not contend with what had just happened. I was excited. However much I was still struggling with the old habit of smoking and drinking, I thought of bringing my wife to

church, but she was a Catholic and I did not know how I would convince her. Mid-January 2022, I was able to convince her to come to church. After two Sundays, we met Mama during an overnight. Mama prayed for us and also said something about our marriage. It didn't go well as there was a possibility that I was going to lose my wife and family if I did not completely turn away from the old bad behaviour.

The meeting with Mama got me thinking deeply. I was blessed that my wife was still by my side. But I was also so stressed that I felt I should lose my life. God is great; I continued to pray with my wife, supporting one another. I never imagined myself losing my family. This was the turning point in my life. 29th January 2022, the same day we had a meeting with Mama Vivian, was the last day I ever tasted alcohol and smoked. At first, I did not think this was possible, but God completely healed and restored me.

The pastors also supported me with various counselling sessions. In less than a year, so much positivity and transformation has happened in my life. I now have a job; my family is together and we are all happy. Abba Father Fellowship welcomed us warmly and we have since been loved. I have never turned back since then.

I now serve as an usher and by God's grace, I will continue to serve in His presence. God restored me from 'Bad Man to God Man'.

IN 2018, I VISITED A MAN OF GOD IN KENYA AND I REMEMBERED HIS WORDS CLEARLY: “YOU WILL MEET A WOMAN OF GOD AND SHE WILL DRINK WATER AND I SEE HER SHARING WATER WITH YOU. AFTERWARDS, YOU WILL CARRY A BABY. SHE HAS THAT ANOINTING, AND IT’S IN UGANDA

In 2015, I got an operation, which didn't go well, and my uterus got issues. The doctors said I would not conceive again. I moved to different churches, but it wasn't my time always. In 2017, my husband got another woman and married her officially.

In 2018, I visited a man of God in Kenya and I remembered his words clearly: "You will meet a woman of God and she will drink water and I see her sharing water with you. Afterwards, you will carry a baby. She has that anointing, and it's in Uganda."

I came to Uganda and moved to every church that had a woman as a prophetess or a pastor, but nothing happened. God is faithful. In 2021, my sister told me about Mama Vivian, but I had lost interest in prayer because I was tired.

One day, she sent a picture of Mama Vivian. When I saw it, immediately, I wanted to meet Mama Vivian, but my sister told me it would not be easy as Mama was in prayer. In October, my sister suggested that we visit the Mbale Altar, but said Mama was not around and it being week day, there would not be any activity in church. I obliged.
